# BOOK WEEK and READING

Each year, schools and libraries across Australia spend a week celebrating books, and Australian authors and illustrators. Teachers and librarians conduct activities relating to the theme chosen - 'Escape to Everywhere'- to highlight the importance of reading and to celebrate Australian children's literature.



#### Why should children read?

Reading books stimulates a child's imagination and expands their understanding of the world. It helps them develop language and listening skills and prepares them to understand the written word.

Did you know that experts in literacy and child development have discovered that if children know eight nursery rhymes by heart by the time they're four years old, they're usually among the best readers by the time they're eight- some food for thought!

Even after children learn to read by themselves, it's still important for you and your child to read aloud together. Below are a few read-aloud tips for Book Week and beyond-

- 1. Spend at least 10 minutes every day reading aloud (that includes the weekend).
- 2. Read aloud with animation- make it exciting!
- 3. Read with joy and enjoyment- joy for the listener and real enjoyment for yourself.
- 4. Read the stories that your child loves.
- 5. Let children hear lots of language by talking to them constantly about the pictures or anything else connected to the book.
- 6. Look for rhyme, rhythm or repetition in books for young children, and make sure the books aren't too long. And ...
- 7. Please read aloud every day because you just adore being with your child and they love it!

In the words of the award winning author Mem Fox, "The fire of literacy is created by the emotional sparks between a child, a book and the person reading".
