

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome Kinders for 2018! Thursday this week, we welcome our Kinders for next year and their families to gather with us. The children will meet their friends as we begin our orientation sessions. These sessions run for the next few weeks. Thank you to everyone for making this a wonderful week for our new students!

As I informed everyone in the previous newsletter, on Wednesday afternoon several school leaders from some Queensland Independent Colleges are coming to witness and learn from the great improvements we have made at MIPS. That morning principals will also visit us from three local state primary schools. Next week, staff from Our Lady of the Rosary, Kellyville will work here in our classes to learn from our implementation of Project Based Learning.

Why am I telling you this?

During the Kinder enrolment interviews, I often am told by prospective parents that in the community people talk about our school as a school that "...does that Open Learning". We don't do 'Open Learning' at MIPS. "Open Learning" is a dated description that makes people think that children wander unassisted in large overcrowded vacant spaces with little purpose or focus on structured learning – something like free-range chickens!

What they see when I take them on a tour of the school is completely contrary to what they have been led to expect. They see our 3 Kindergarten classes, welcoming, well-staffed and highly structured for learning. They are amazed how the Year One and Two classes have the opportunity to use the incredible TAS area to spread out and work together if that best-suits the learning. I am able to talk with them about how even from Kinder our students work with the teachers to set and complete high-level goals for their learning.

They see how the learning is tailored to enhance every child's learning. They see how we have evolved student learning and the learning areas across the school to provide the best of resources and structures. They see how we are enabling all children to be active participants in achieving outstanding learning outcomes. They see so much more of the things we are implementing that make our school a lighthouse school, as we have been identified by visiting international and neighbouring colleagues. They are amazed and excited about the future education of their children. I am so proud to take people on tours of our fabulous school!

So when you are in the supermarket, on the sidelines at sport events, talking with friends,anywhere and you are asked about our school, I urge you to inform people that we do not do "Open Learning" and to tell them what we actually do do – We continually improve our school to provide the best learning opportunity for all our students and we do this with a sense of community and urgency. If they can't believe it's so great, tell them I am happy to show them!

2018 PARRAMATTA DIOCESAN TEAM SPORT TRIALS

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close this Friday 27th October as these trials will be held in November 2017. All other sport registrations will open in November for 2018 trials.

Any Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2018 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2017 and Term One in 2018. In some sports students in Year 4 *MAY* nominate.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2018 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au

This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2018 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. Parents may complete this form to attend a selection trial. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by the child's school**. In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. **All fields and especially "Representative Experience" MUST be completed.**

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before. If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid- December at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

How to apply

Step 1: Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at **transportnsw.info/school-students**

Step 2: The school endorses your application.

Step 3: Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application






HEALTHY KIDS CUCINA CANTEEN

The Parents and Friends Committee of Mary Immaculate Primary School would like to invite all families to attend the upcoming AGM on Wednesday 15th November 2017 at 7pm in the staffroom.

The Parents and Friends Association (P and F) invite all parents and caregivers of children attending Mary Immaculate to our Annual General Meeting for 2017. This is an opportunity to review the events undertaken in 2017 by the P and F Association and to assess what opportunities exist for 2018.

The P and F is responsible for undertaking many activities throughout the year, as well as being a forum to ask important questions regarding the education of our children. Your assistance and support ensures we are able to undertake activities and support the leadership of Mary Immaculate Primary School with their initiatives. New faces are always welcome, as well as new ideas for the year ahead for:

- Improving the effectiveness of the P and F
- Reviewing fundraising over the previous year and planning fundraising events for 2018
- Looking at our social activities
- Identifying other opportunities the P and F can assist the school

Your active participation provides a very rewarding experience and a very important service within our school, helping to create the memories and experiences of our children during their time at Mary Immaculate Primary. Whether you are new to the school community in 2018, or have been involved for many years, the P and F would love your support next year.

History of the Mary Immaculate P and F Association

In 2010, the formation of the P and F Association was a means by which a more structured planning process could take shape, with parents and the school leadership team to drive and build on a greater community spirit, and to support the great work being undertaken by the teachers within our school. Additionally, the P and F was to be a forum for discussions on key issues which impact on our school community. Since inception, the P and F has raised over \$75,000 for projects around the school, as well as helping to build a calendar of community and social events that have become an integral part of the school.

Frequently Asked Questions

The most common questions asked by parents wanting to be involved at the school concern time and commitment. Whilst the P and F meet twice per term to discuss issues of importance, your support can be as much time as you can afford. We all lead busy family and work lives, and the more parents who are able to assist, the easier things become. Most of our events throughout the school year are planned well in advance based on previous years, so in a majority of cases, all that is needed are parents to support these events, and help generate ideas for the future.

Our Constitution

MIPS P AND F ASSOCIATION



Various roles within the P and F exist to create a structure by which activities and support for the school can be undertaken in an easy way to

follow, regardless of experience. Each role plays an important part to ensure the P and F maintains its constitutional obligations, and more importantly, to ensure continued support for the staff and children at Mary Immaculate. Additionally, assistant roles have been formed within the P and F to provide parents undertaking roles with greater support and to allow workloads to be shared amongst a larger group of parents. Maximum terms for any individual to be elected to specific positions apply. Therefore the involvement of new parents is essential to ensure there is adequate rotation and sharing of responsibilities.

- President Ensures the smooth running of the Association. In addition, the President will liaise with the Principal, Parish Priest and School Executive on matters of importance and in the preparation and running of Association meetings.
- Vice President Assists the President in the undertaking of the above duties, and chairs the Association meetings in the absence of the President.
- Secretary Assists with the taking of minutes during Association meetings and is responsible for the handling of correspondence to and from the Association. In addition, the Secretary may prepare and finalise Association Newsletters for distribution.
- Assistant Secretary Supports the Secretary in undertaking the above duties, and assumes the role
 of Secretary at Association meetings in their absence.
- Treasurer Receives all money collected by the Association and ensures accurate record keeping of all financial transactions. The Treasurer is also responsible for payment or reimbursement of all Association costs approved by the Executive.
- Assistant Treasurer Assists the Treasurer in the undertaking of the above activities. More importantly, is an opportunity for new parents to learn the role for future years.
- Fundraising/Social Coordinator Assumes responsibility for the overall planning of the events calendar. Has the ability to delegate responsibility for individual events to Assistant Coordinators.
- Assistant Fundraising/Social Coordinators Assist the Coordinator in the planning of events.
 Assistant coordinators are able to undertake the planning of individual events and chair subcommittees for events where required.
- Communications Officer compiles P and F newsletter, designs and publishes promotional material and ensures information is distributed to families regarding P and F events and initiatives.
- Maintenance Coordinator Liaise with the School Executive and maintenance staff in the planning and coordination of working bees, and identification of projects
- PRC Representative Represent the School on the Parents Representative Council of the Parramatta Diocese.

All of the above positions, as well as being an active participant in scheduled P and F meetings are equally important, and we encourage all parents and caregivers to consider how they can contribute to the P and F Association in 2018.

When we enrolled our children into the school we agreed to support the school. This is a way to directly assist your child's school to further support your child.
