STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY MONDAY 7th SEPTEMBER

KISS AND DROP GUIDELINES

The car park area immediately outside the school office (near the Grotto) is a Kiss and Drop area. This Kiss and Drop area operates from 8.25am till 8.55am every school morning. The purpose of the Kiss and Drop is to provide an efficient way of dropping your children at school in a safe environment where they can easily access the playground. Parents are asked to assist in the functioning of the Kiss and Drop by doing two things:

- Do not park in the Kiss and Drop area between 8.25am and 8.55am
- Do not get out of your car to say goodbye to your children do this while they are in the car.

Ideally, your car should pull up in the Kiss and Drop and your children will get out of the left side of your car with their bag and they head off to school. (Parents do not get out of their car). If we all follow these guidelines we all help to move our children into school safely and efficiently without causing undue lengthy queues of cars waiting to drop off their children.

SUPERVISION

Any child not collected by their parents or caregivers by 3:50pm are taken to the school office and parents are contacted. All children continue to be supervised after 3:50pm by the Principal or Assistant Principal until collected by their parents or caregivers.

With the exception of Guide Dogs, no animals are to be brought onto the school grounds without the permission of the Principal. Regardless of how placid a pet may be at home, animals can react differently when surrounded by many children in an unfamiliar place. We make this rule for the safety of all children in our care. 
