At the end of last week, we invited our students to have a voice in calling out bullying at MIPS. This is a vital part of stopping bullying - to lift any veil that might cover up what is happening.

The brutal and repulsive acts of violence in Christchurch appropriately received global condemnation and outrage. Those acts were meant to terrorise, to divide and to proclaim one sector of society as being more superior than the rest. Instead, they have unified the world in denouncing these acts and their intent.

The fact that the perpetrator is an Australian adds quite a layer of confusion for all of us. This occurred of course following the conviction of George Pell which has raised many thoughts and feeling across the globe and locally.

These events were at the forefront of my mind over the weekend. And then when I was at Mass on Sunday evening we heard the reading of the Transfiguration of the Lord - revealed as the Son of God. I wondered why this reading struck such a chord in me at this time and then it became clear. People the people who spoke up this week for the values of Love, Justice, Inclusivity and Compassion - are people revealing Jesus to us by their Christian values and actions. Repeatedly on the news over the weekend, people reinforced their commitment and belief that "Love will always conquer Hate". I am sure that we all rally to that at MIPS.


MIPS CROSS COUNTRY FUN RUN



NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM - LITERACY AND NUMERACY (NAPLAN) 2019

Dear Parents / Caregivers,

In May 2019 the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3 and 5. NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools. This year your child will sit the NAPLAN online tests.

The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.

Student background information (student name, gender, date of birth, language background and Aboriginality) will be collected as part of the National Assessment Program. This information is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that every student's right to privacy is maintained.

Prior to the official test, students will partake in a practice test to help familiarise them to the online formatting and test conditions

The NAPLAN online <u>PRACTICE</u> test will be conducted on Tuesday 2nd April (Year 5) Wednesday 3rd April (Year 3)

NAPLAN will be conducted from 14th - 24th May 2019.

^{***} The written test can only be completed on the 14th or 15th of May as per NESA requirements.

Students who miss a test or are absent on a test day, will resume testing when they return to school during the testing period.

Disability adjustments which reflect the student's normal level of support in the classroom may be provided.

Students may be considered for exemption from the tests if they:



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- are newly arrived in Australia (less than one year before the test) and with a language background other than English, or
- have a significant intellectual disability and/or significant co-existing conditions which severely limit their capacity to participate in the tests.

All other students are expected to participate in the tests.

Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN by their parent or carer. This is a matter for consideration by parents in consultation with the school principal, Mr Dowd. If you wish to withdraw your child from the tests, a parent or carer consent form must be signed. Forms are available from the school office and must be returned by this Friday 4^{th} May, 2018.

Parents and students are encouraged to access the **Public Demonstration** site to familiarise themselves with the types of questions and functionalities of NAPLAN Online. The demonstration site covers sample questions but does not reflect the range of skills which will be assessed in the NAPLAN test. The demonstration tests can be found at https://nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site

Parents are required to download the **NAP browser** onto their child's device to give them secure access to the official and practice tests. This will need to be done as soon as possible so we are able to rectify any issues with devices. Parents are asked to download this at home using the following link https://naplan.parra.catholic.edu.au/download

All students will require headphones for all test sessions and we ask that this is organised prior to the date of assessments. In the numeracy tests students will not require any measuring tools such as rulers or protractors.
