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Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to Term Three!

Last term, our students entered into new territory – elaborately articulating and sharing their semester learning journey with their families. Some parents chose to follow this up with an interview with their child's teacher. This 'new territory' relates to raising of the bar in learning. This was a significant challenge for the students that required of them a whole new set of skills and understandings. For a first time effort, they were incredible. We had some learnings as a school as well and will be looking to use feedback from students, parents and teachers moving forward. More to come on that soon.

I spoke with the students this morning at assembly about the semester ahead. I used the weekend's Gospel reading, the parable of the sower, to talk about how this parable not only has a message for us about knowing Jesus and following his example. I shared with them that the parable also can be related to our learning – how deep learning is the seed that has been planted and nurtured in good soil. This second semester, we will be further exploring deep learning and ways of knowing – from simple to complex, from isolated to transferred.

This has been an amazing year to date and we look forward to working also with our families in new ways such as Seesaw. We are presently working with our central office to update our website and other methods of communication. There is much in the pipeline for the remainder of this year – so let's get started!

ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL

Supervision begins at 8:25am. Children should not be left at school before this time.

A 'kiss and drop' zone operates in the morning if you do not wish to walk your child into school. Adults must stay in the car at all times if using the 'kiss and drop' zone. The children's bags must be in the car with them to ensure they can exit quickly. At no time can a car be left unattended in the 'kiss and drop' zone.

If you wish to walk your child into school, please drive up the ramp to the car park. Children take their bags to the classroom and then must go straight to the playground for supervision. No one is to remain in the building before school unless they have made a formal appointment with a staff member. If this is the case, you must sign in at the office. Parents who come down onto the playground are asked to stand to the side and allow their child to socialise with the other children on the playground. The perimeter gates are locked each morning after assembly. The Barnier Drive main gate entrance remains open during the day.

DEPARTURE FROM SCHOOL

School finishes at 3:20pm and we appreciate your efforts to pick up your child promptly at that time. Supervision ceases at 3:40pm. The 'kiss and drop' zone does not operate in the afternoon. Parents/caregivers are required to park in the top car park and collect children from the designated point outside the building. Please do not go into the building to collect children from classrooms. Please note, children are not allowed to walk to the car park and meet their parents. They must be collected from the teacher. The perimeter gates are closed after the last bus leaves in the afternoon. If there is an emergency and you are late to collect your child, please contact the school office. Children can become anxious when parents are late or they are unclear about their afternoon arrangements.

YEAR 6 PEER SUPPORT - Commencing Next Week "Stronger Together"

What is the Peer Support program?

The Peer Support program provides students with a supportive environment where children and young people develop skills, understandings, attitudes and strategies to improve their mental, social and emotional wellbeing. Positive relationships are developed across the school through a series of engaging activities with a range of students of all ages. The program enables participating students to contribute in an environment where all can join in. Those students helping to lead the program also gain leadership skills.

How does Peer Support work?

Our students will meet in small, mixed level groups every week for 8 weeks. Sessions will run for about 40 minutes using materials from Peer Support Australia. Peer Support Australia's mission is to provide an evidence based, peer led approach to enhance the mental, social and emotional

wellbeing of young people. Peer Support has trained our staff and our staff have trained our student Peer Leaders to run supervised sessions to develop protective factors and strengthen positive relationships across the school. Peer Leaders will work with small groups of students from K/P- Year 5. Using Peer Leaders means we have student role models who can help our staff and parents encourage positive relationships.

The Stronger Together module

The module builds on research from health promotion, prevention and positive psychology approaches.

The module covers the following topics:

- ~ Week 2 Feeling safe Being me!
- ~ Week 3 Strong me!
- ~ Week 4 Including others
- ~ Week 5 Makethechange
- Week 6 Knowyour rights
- ~ Week 7 Makeachoice
- ~ Week 8 Standingtogether
- ~ Week 9 Take the lead!

The students identify their own strengths and then discuss what is respectful and what are unhealthy behaviours and how strategies, including talking to staff and parents can help. The module reinforces some of our schools key values and our policy and procedures.

Parent and Family Support

Bullying is defined in our sessions as unhelpful behaviour that is repeated and intends to cause harm and involves an unkind use of social or personal influence.

Parents might find the sessions are an opportunity for discussion with their child or children about how and they feel about the relationships at school. Friendships and socialising with other students is a big area of learning for most children. They are an important key to enjoying school and learning. Parents asking about each session leven obtaining a copy of a more detailed outline] can help students think about the learning.



Religious Education

Baptism: This term students will be introduced to the sacrament of Baptism. They will learn more about the meaning of Baptism through a study of the ritual actions and symbols used in their own Baptism. Students will also have the opportunity to learn about the Baptism of Jesus.

Senses a Gift from God: In this unit students will understand that their senses are important in communicating, relating to others and in expressing their love for God and others. They will develop an understanding of their senses, as a gift from God.

Year 3 Term 3 Grade Overview 2017

MARY IMMACULATE LOVE & SERVICE

Geography Places are both similar and different:

Students examine natural and human features of Australia and the diverse characteristics of Australia's neighbouring countries. They explore the different climates, settlement patterns and demographic characteristics of places and use this information to imagine what it would be like to live in different places. Students consider how people's perceptions of places are the basis for actions to protect places and environments.

Religious Education

This term the following units will be taught:

Mary. A woman of faith.

Student will demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of the Church as a welcoming, caring and celebrating community, which began its mission at Pentecost under the inspiration, and guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The Bible: A special book.

Students will investigate the inspiration, contents, structure and literary forms of the Bible. They will develop confidence in using the Bible to learn about God's revelation and covenant with the people of Israel. Students will be encouraged to interpret the meaning of key biblical passages, especially accounts of Jesus' example and teachings, for their own lives.

Library: Thursday

Children will be dismissed each day from the front concrete.

English

Writing: Students will be writing using various genres including imaginative, persuasive and informative. Ongoing development of writing skills including grammar, punctuation and sentence structure are taught in the context of writing tasks.

Reading: Modelled, shared and guided reading will continue daily. During these sessions spelling, grammar and word knowledge will be covered. Students will continue to use a range of skills and strategies to enhance their fluency. **Speaking and Listening:** Class oral presentations, group research presentations and role-play.

Personal Development Health:

<u>Peer Support:</u> Peer Support provides students with a supportive environment to develop skills and strategies to improve their mental, social and emotional well being. This term's theme will be 'Stronger Together', an anti bullying program.

<u>Life Education</u>: At Life Education students will identify safety signs, recognise the factors of a healthy lifestyle and explore how positive relationships benefit our health and wellbeing.

Physical Education:

<u>**Dance:**</u> Performs a range of movement patterns and dance styles.

Writing and Representing: Students will continue learning about writing persuasive texts and informative texts. Attention will be given to structure, spelling, grammar and vocabulary. Reading and Viewing: Students will participate in a variety of modelled, shared and independent reading activities. Tasks include reciprocal teaching, reader's theatre, comprehension activities, vocabulary activities, current event activities and spelling and grammar.

Speaking and Listening: Students will be involved in a variety of formal and informal speaking and listening activities, including 'Share Time', oral presentations, feedback and personal responses.

Mathematics

Number & Algebra: Students will count, order, read and record numbers of up to five digits. Students will use mental and written strategies for addition and subtraction, and multiplication and division.

Measurement & Geometry: Students will use simple maps and grids to represent position and follow routes. Students will identify, describe, compare and classify angles. Students will measure, record, compare and estimate volumes and capacities using litres, millilitres and cubic centimetres. Students will read and record time.

<u>Statistics & Probability:</u> Students will describe and compare chance events in social and experimental contexts.

Personal Development Health:

<u>Peer Support:</u> Children will work in groups with other students across the school to learn about values.

Physical Education:

<u>**Dance:**</u> Students will perform a range of movement patterns and dance styles.

Year 5 Term 3 Grade Overview 2017



Religion

Confirmation:

In this unit students will learn about the Sacrament of Confirmation in a way that complements the preparation of the sacrament. They will also learn about the Holy Spirit as revealed in the Scripture and in the doctrine of the Church.

The Story of my Parish:

This unit explores a variety of expressions of Christianity within Australia, including Catholicism. Students will become more aware of the traditions, community life, styles of worship and forms of ministry of the Anglican and Uniting Churches in particular.

Personal Development Health

Personal Development: Students will participate in Personal Development & Health lessons in class focusing on the Unit, "I Like Me" targeted towards Growth & Development, Roles & Responsibilities and Bullying.

Peer Support: In this unit children will work in groups with other students across the school to describe and explain their roles and responsibilities in developing and maintaining positive relationships.

Physical Education:

<u>**Dance:**</u> Performs a range of movement patterns and dance styles.

Games and Sports: AFL/Touch Football.

Geography

Changes & The Environment:

This unit provides opportunities for children to investigate how people change the natural environment in Australia and in other places around the world. Students will explore the impact that floods and bushfires have on the Australian environment and people and propose ways people can reduce the impact of these phenomena in the future.

English

Writing and Representing: The focus will be on writing to explain and describe aspects of changes in the environment with a specific focus on natural phenomena, such a bushfires, floods and landslides. A range of text types including informative and persuasive focusing on structure, descriptive language and depth will be taught.

Reading and Viewing: The students experience a balance of modelled, guided and individual reading with a focus on readers theatre and dialogue.

<u>Speaking and Listening:</u> Students listen to and participate in discussions focusing on thinking and saying verbs to create appropriate modality in a discussion. Emphasis will be placed upon eye contact and voice projection.

General

<u>Homework:</u> Starts Week 2- online through studyladder or English and Maths. Projects to be started Week 3.

Sport uniform: Tuesday and Friday

Library: Thursday

Daily Warm-Up: Warm-up activities to encourage the children to think logically and mathematically when completing activities.

Number and Algebra: working with fractions, decimals and percentages.

Measurement and Geometry: 2D and 3D shapes, Area of a triangle, Position.

<u>Statistics and Probability</u>: working with mean, median, mode and range of numbers.

Creative and Practical Arts

<u>Drama:</u> Exploring the elements of Drama: – Students will be involved in a range of activities based around the elements of drama.

<u>Visual Arts:</u> Students will experience a range of techniques and skills, which will be integrated, with other areas of the curriculum with Mrs Boatfield.

Religious Education

36C5 Eucharist Nourishes us for the Journey Students will examine the celebration of the Eucharist as both a memorial sacrifice and memorial meal. Their study will focus on how Christ nourishes us through the celebration of the Eucharist through the gift of himself present in the assembly, celebrant, Word and Holy Communion.

35C5 Faith Communities in our local area: Explores a variety of expressions of Christianity within Australia including Catholicism. Students become aware of the traditions, community life, styles of worship and forms of ministry of the Anglican and Uniting Church. This unit introduces the work of ecumenism in attempting to restore unity amongst Christian churches.

Religious Literacy Assessment: students engage in an online, Diocesan-wide assessment recalling Religious content covered throughout their primary school education.

<u>Science</u>

Earth's Place in Space: The Earth's place in Space unit is an ideal way to link science with literacy in the classroom. It provides opportunities for students to explore how the patterns in the sky relate to days, months and years. Students' understanding of how observation and models can be used to shape ideas and understandings is developed through Project Based Learning. Students also investigate the elements of our Solar System and Earth's position within it.

English

Writing and Representing: The writing focus for the first five weeks will be based on poetry. The grammar, sentence structure and language techniques will be explicitly taught through modeled, jointly constructed and independent writing lessons. The remaining five weeks will focus on persuasive writing.

Reading and Viewing: Literacy Groups will include a reading focus based on key strategies involved in creating effective comprehension skills. This will be taught through modeled and independent reading lessons.

<u>Speaking and Listening:</u> Students listen to and participate in discussions focusing on thinking and saying verbs to create appropriate modality in a discussion. Emphasis will be placed upon eye contact and voice projection.
