MENTAL COMPUTATION STRATEGIES

There are many different mental strategies students can use to answer addition and subtraction problems. Here are some different strategies that students at Mary Immaculate are using within Mathematics Lessons.

ADDITION

Doubles

Doubles are all around us; think of fingers and toes -5+5, wheels on a car -2+2, or the eggs in a carton -6+6. When students know their doubles well, they should no longer have to think about the equation to solve it. Rather, the answer becomes automatic.




Near Doubles

Near doubles strategy is when you double a number and adjust. E.G. 5+6 (Think double 5 + 1 = 11), 7 + 6 (Think double 7 - 1 = 13.)


Bridging to Ten

We can use number lines to bridge to the next ten and then add what is left.



Jump Strategy


The jump strategy is when you use a number line to jump in tens and then units.



SUBTRACTION STRATEGIES


Using related facts

Knowing one addition fact means you also know two related subtraction facts. Because 7+3=10 you also know that 10 - 7 = 3 and 10 - 3 = 7.



Bridging to Ten.

Bridge to the next ten and when count on what is left.




Counting on

If there is only a small difference between numbers, use counting on to find the difference. See: 32-28 = ? Think: What can you add to 28 to get 32? Count on 4.



Jump Strategy

When we subtract, we can use the jump strategy to help us. Look at 99 - 42: First we jump back by the tens. Then we jump back by the units.



Split strategy

When subtracting large numbers in our heads it can be easier to split the number to be subtracted into parts and work with each part separately.

I understand that failure to make the full Vacation Care fee payment by December 11, will result in my child/ren's position at Vacation Care being cancelled without notice.

I understand that no further bookings OR changes to bookings will be accepted after Monday, 11th December 2017.

I agree to abide by all policies and procedures of Catholic Out of School Hours Care.

I accept that children will be supervised at all times, and that all travel between the Centre and excursion venue will be in privately booked buses with seatbelts.

I understand that excursions are compulsory for all children booked in on that day to attend and that the number of participants will not exceed the licensed number.

I understand that "Excursion and Incursion Risk Assessments" have been completed prior to the event and are available to me upon request.

I understand that the ratio's that COSHC adheres to is 1:15 for onsite days and 1:8 for all excursions (water based excursions are 1:5). Additional carers will be rostered where it is deemed to be necessary, based on the activity risk assessment.

I accept that it is my responsibility to ensure we are at the Centre by 8:00am on excursion days (unless another time is specified). I understand that the bus will not wait and I will need to make alternative care arrangements for my child/ren if we arrive late.

I understand that I am required to sign my child in and out of the program each day. Written notification is required to allow another person to collect my child if they are not listed as an authorised contact.

I understand that my children may be required to participate in activities that may be physically and emotionally demanding. My children's participation in any activity is non compulsory. COSHC staff will duly exercise their Duty of Care.

I agree to support the centre in implementing the Sun Protection Policy by my child/ren wearing Sun-safe clothing with sleeves & collar, sun-safe hat and sports shoes & socks.

I understand that all programs will continue in the event of inclement weather unless notified. understand that should the scheduled venue need to change due to inclement weather, the back up venues COSHC will use are the Movies, Bowling and Sydney Aquarium/Wildlife World.

I understand that COSHC will take no responsibility for lost property. This includes all electronic devices.
