On the freezing, foggy morning of April the 25th, hundreds of people, including students from Mary Immaculate, gathered together in the streets of Riverstone. We marched together, towards the stage where the ceremony would be held. As we passed, we saw policemen and surviving soldiers surrounding a statue in the centre of the street, standing at attention.

We all felt a sense of pride as we heartily sang our Australian Anthem. Many people gave their speech on what ANZAC day meant to them, and we were also reflecting on what it meant to us during the Last Post and the Minute of Silence. We were called up to the stage with the rest of the schools and sporting clubs to lay our wreath underneath the sculpture. It felt like such a privilege to be able to add our own contribution to a cause that people sacrificed their own lives in. It felt like such an honour to just attend the ceremony.

Being there filled us with a range of emotions, showing our respect to the soldiers that served us in war. We laid the wreath with pride, in honour of everyone that sacrificed their lives for us. We all felt proud to be Australian, as they raised the flag, as we sang the national anthem and as they played 'The Last Post'.

During the minute of silence we reflected deeply about those who died in war and the things they sacrificed for their country, Australia. We didn't gather to celebrate these soldiers but commemorate them, remember them, as the people who sacrificed their own lives for the country. They made the greatest sacrifice whether they knew it or not.

As John the Apostle once said, 'There is no greater love, than to lay down your life for a friend'.

Please look out for the note being sent home for this <u>event</u>, and return your RSVP slip as soon as possible.


